Pay \$1 for Fall Fun with Access Pass

at The Children's Museum of Indianapolis

This fall, it's time to take the family on an adventure to the remote polar ice caps, slipping and sliding with penguins and polar bears. Hobnob with ghouls and goblins as you creep through the spookiest Hoosier haunts. It's all starting this October at The Children's Museum of Indianapolis.

The world's largest children's museum is opening two amazing exhibits this fall: *Polar Bears to Penguins*, a multimedia experience that explores The Arctic and Antarctica, and the Indiana favorite, *Skeletown*, the 47th Annual Haunted House.



Skeletown, which runs from Oct. 16 to Oct. 31, takes visitors through a tour of the city's spookiest destinations. Both Frightening Hours (with the lights off) and IPL Lights-On Hours (for children who scare easily) are available. Tickets are \$6.50 at the door but members receive a discount.

Inside *Polar Bears to Penguins*, available from Oct. 9 to Jan. 2, visitors can look at the poles through the eyes of explorers, walk and slide like a penguin, and learn about the science of the Aurora Borealis.
